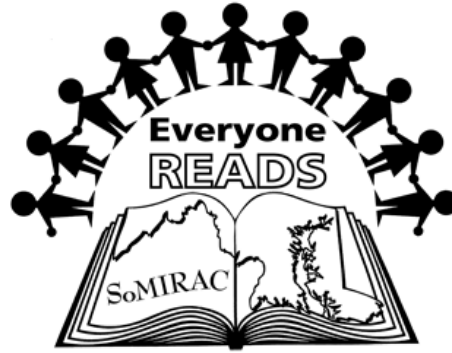




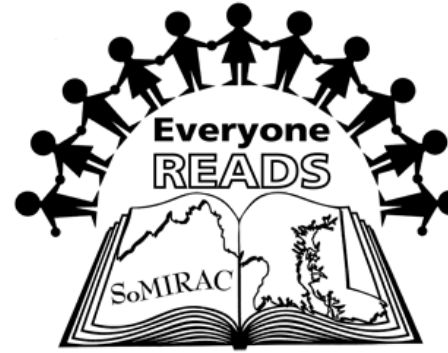
Read **to** your child.
